

I STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

This Cash Management Plan (the 'plan') has been prepared pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:5-14 in order to set forth the basis for deposits ('deposits') and permitted investments ('investments') of certain public funds of the Pine Hill Fire District #1, pending the use of such funds for the intended purposes. The plan is intended to assure that all such public funds are deposited in interest bearing accounts or permitted investments. The intent of the Plan is to provide that the decisions made with regard to the Deposits and the Permitted Investments will be made in a manner intended to insure the safety and preservation of principal value, the liquidity (regarding its availability for the intended purpose) and the maximum investment return within such limits. The plan is intended to insure that any deposit or permitted investment matures within the time period that approximates the prospective need for the funds deposited or invested so that there is not a risk to the market value of such deposits or permitted investments.

II IDENTIFICATION OF FUNDS AND ACCOUNTS TO BE COVERED BY THE PLAN

The Plan is intended to cover the deposit and or investment of the following governmental fund types and accounts of the Pine Hill Fire District #1 as follows:

General Fund
Special Revenue Fund
Debt Service Fund
Capital Projects Fund
General Long-Term Debt Account Group

III DESIGNATION OF OFFICIALS OF THE PINE HILL FIRE DISTRICT #1 AUTHORIZED TO MAKE DEPOSITS AND INVESTMENTS UNDER THE PLAN

The Fire District Administrator of the Pine Hill Fire District #1 shall be charged with the administering of this plan. The Fire District Administrator shall monitor all deposits and investments for consistency with this plan. No person shall engage in an investment transaction involving Pine Hill Fire District #1 funds except as directed or authorized by the Fire District Administrator. Prior to making such deposits or permitted investments, all authorized depositories or investment facilities shall be supplied with a written copy of this plan, which shall be acknowledged in writing by such parties and a copy of such acknowledgement shall be kept on file with the Fire District.

The Fire District Administrator shall be permitted to perform transfers of funds between accounts utilizing the internet services provided by the local bank.

- (e) which is in compliance with rules adopted pursuant to the "Administrative" Procedure Act", P.L. 1968, c.410 (c52:14B-1 et seq.) by the Local Finance Board of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs, which rules shall provide for disclosure and reporting requirements, and other provisions deemed necessary by the board to provide for the safety, liquidity and yield of the investments;
- (f) which does not permit investments in instruments that: are subject to high price volatility with changing market conditions; cannot reasonably be expected, at the time of interest rate adjustment, to have a market value that approximates their par value; or utilize an index that does not support a stable net asset value; and
- (g) which purchases and redeems investments directly from the issuer, government money market mutual fund, or the State of New Jersey Cash Management Fund, or through the use of a national or State bank located within this State, or through a broker-dealer which, at the time of purchase or redemption, has been registered continuously for a period of at least two years pursuant to section 9 of P.I. 1967 c.9 (C.49:3-56) and has at least \$25 million in capital stock (or equivalent capitalization if not a corporation), surplus reserves for contingencies and undivided profits, or through a securities dealer who makes primary markets in U.S. Government securities and reports daily to the Federal Reserve Bank of New York its position in and borrowing on such U.S. Government securities.

VII SAFEKEEPING CUSTODY PAYMENT AND ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RECEIPT OF PLAN

To the extent that any Deposit or Permitted Investment involves a document or security which is not physically held by the Pine Hill Fire District #1, then such instrument or security shall be covered by a custodial agreement with an independent third party, which shall be a bank or financial institution, in the State of New Jersey. Such institution shall provide for the designation of such investments in the name of the Pine Hill Fire District #1 to assure that there is no

- A. The name of any institution holding funds of the Pine Hill Fire District #1 as a Deposit or a Permitted Investment.
- B. The amount of securities or Deposits purchased or sold during the immediately preceding month.
- C. The class or type of securities purchased or Deposits made.
- D. The book value of such Deposits or Permitted Investments.
- E. The earned income on such Deposits or Permitted Investments. To the extent that such amounts are actually earned at maturity, this report shall provide an accrual of such earnings during the immediately preceding month.
- F. The fees incurred to undertake such Deposits or Permitted Investments.
- G. The market value of all Deposits or Permitted Investments as of the end of the immediately preceding month.
- H. All other information which may be deemed reasonable from time to time by the governing body of the Pine Hill Fire District #1.

IX TERM OF PLAN

This Plan shall be in effect from the date of this resolution to December 31, 2023. Attached to this Plan is a Resolution of the governing body of the Pine Hill Fire District #1 approving this Plan for such period of time. This Plan may be amended from time to time. Each speaker shall be limited to five (5) minutes per speaker with a limit of two speaking opportunities. The two (2) per person speaking opportunity shall not be consecutive so as to allow other members of the public to make an appropriate speaking opportunity presentation to the Board. When each person who desires to speak at the public meeting has had an opportunity to address the Board, a person may be recognized for a second speaking opportunity. The second speaking opportunity is also limited to five minutes. The practice of yielding time to or borrowing time from others is not permitted.
- Foul, vulgar or course language shall not be tolerated. b)
- At the discretion of Chairman of the Board of Fire Commissioners, with the consent of the c) majority of Board members present, on issues being presented, this time limitation may be relaxed or extended from time to time and such extension, relaxation or suspension of time limitation shall not constitute a binding precedent for other speakers on other issues.
- d) Large groups on single issues are urged to select a spokesperson to present their concerns.
- e) Any desired question to specific members of the Board shall be directed to the Board Chairman for recognition of specific Board members. The intent is to avoid a "back and forth" exchange. Board Members may or may not respond to any public presentment after there has been a completion of the public speaker's presentment.

Chief's Monthly Report

November 2022

Meetings:

- On Thursday evening the 3rd, I attended the commission meeting.
- On Monday evening the 11th, I held a department officer's meeting.
- On Tuesday evening the 8th, I attended the fire department company meeting.
- On Thursday evening the 10th, I attended the Camden County Fire Chief's meeting.
- On Friday morning the 11th, I attended the Veterans Service.
- On Monday morning the 28th, I attended the Christmas Parade meeting at the boro hall.

Calls for Service / Significant Concerns:

- Late afternoon on Saturday the 5th, we were dispatched to unit 1001 in Bromley Estates for a vehicle into the building, with entrapment. I arrived first and confirmed that the driver was out of the vehicle, but we had two residents trapped on the second floor. The vehicle had gone through the front door trapping the residents. The residents were rescued off the rear balcony via a ground ladder. The construction official was notified and did respond. The water was secured, and the electric was turned off because of exposed wires. The construction official did condemn the residence. Red Cross was contacted for 5 adults and 5 kids.
- On Saturday morning the 12th, I responded to the ShopRite in Blackwood for a building fire. Engine 62 stretched a hand line in the building. Ladder 62 went to the roof for ventilation (roof cuts). Squad 62 was sent to the rear to cut open the trailer that was on fire. Chief 62 had command in the rear of the building.
- On Tuesday morning the 22nd, I responded along with Squad 62 / Ladder 62 to a house fire in Winslow. I was third to arrive and was placed in the operations role. We had fire through the roof of a two-story single-family dwelling. Squad 62 arrived fourth and was advised to lay in and put their deck gun in service on the "D" side of the dwelling. Ladder 62's crew were sent to the rear and place a 2 ½" hose line off squad 62.
- On Tuesday afternoon the 29th, we were dispatched for a garage fire at 42 East 8th, in Pine Hill. I arrived first and had heavy smoke and fire showing with a one-story single-family dwelling as an exposure. Engine 62 was ordered to take the hydrant in front off

55 East 8th and stretched the 400′ 1 ¾ handline to rear of the dwelling. Squad 86 arrived and assisted Engine 62 with stretching and extinguishing the fire. Engine 86 stretched a second 1 ¾ handline off Engine 62 to the "D" side of the dwelling. Ladder 62 took the front of the dwelling and their crew assisted with overhaul. The fire was investigated by FM62.

Inspira:

- I spoke with the street supervisor and confirmed that they will be providing an ambulance for the Christmas Parade.
- On Monday the 7th, I sent a letter to Inspira asking them to dismiss the ambulance transport for Spencer Mills. They have agreed to waive the transport fee.

BLS62:

 We will have our ambulance staffed for the Christmas Parade and we will also have 2 members on bikes

Southern County Regional Taskforce:

• Thank you to our commissioners for signing the agreement. The documents have been passed on to Berlin to sign.

Triad:

- On Friday the 21st, I completed and sent a grant application to South Jersey Gas. The request is for \$4400 to purchase 40 raincoats for our members.
- We did receive a response from South Jersey Gas that we were not approved for the grant.

Training:

- On Friday morning the 18th, Battalion Chief Pizzo and I had a meeting with Station 85 (Lambs Terrace). The meeting was held with the chairman of their board and the fire chief. We discussed some major issues that occurred at the ShopRite fire in Blackwood. At that meeting we offered to help train their member on ladder company operations. More to come on this.
- On Monday evening the 14th, we held the PIA (post incident analysis) for the 4-alarm fire
 that we had at the Mansions. This was well attended by our members and the mutual
 aid companies. We did get answers to things that took place on the fire ground and
 good information was passed on to the mutual aid companies. We had about 50
 firefighters attend this PIA.

• On Tuesday evening the 22nd, I attended our annual burn at the Fire Academy. This training is a requirement within our department to stay pack certified. We had 24 members participate.

Box Changes:

As stated previously, our box changes have been submitted and approved. Along with
the box changes and to stay compliant with the County & NIMS (National Incident
Management System), we will be changing our truck numbers when we sign on
responding to calls. We are the 6th district within Camden County and will now use the
number 6 instead of 62 when responding to calls (TL6, SD6, Eng6, Brush6, and chief6).
At this point we are going to keep the trucks numbered and lettered as they are. We
might change in the future.

Long Range Planning:

 On Saturday afternoon the 5th, Battalion Chief Pizzo and I visited Superior Modular Homes in Hammonton. The committee is looking into the possibility of placing a modular home on the side of the building, were the antenna used to be. This will act as the bunkrooms / living quarters we so desperately need.

Tree Lighting:

• On Wednesday afternoon the 23rd, we assisted the public works with placing the star on top of the tree for the tree lighting.

Reimbursable Services:

 As stated in the beginning of the year with my goals to complete in the year 2022, was billing for motor vehicle accidents / any type of rescue. Attached you will find a fee schedule that list dollar amounts based on the level of service that is provided. You will also find what I will call an ordinance for the Vineland NJ Fire Department. I can assume that we would need to do the same thing. EMS Consulting has agreed to take care of the billing for us as they do for EMS transports.

Vacation:

I took two days' vacation on Thursday the 24th & Friday the 25th.

§ 56-28. Reimbursable services.

Services shall be reimbursable whenever a Fire Department vehicle and equipment respond to an emergency rescue incident. Said emergency shall include, but not be limited to, a motor vehicle accident, hazardous material spill or technical rescue incident. Emergency services provided shall include, but not be limited to, extrication by the use of any specialized equipment. Fees for incidents involve multiple vehicles shall be established on a per-vehicle basis.

§ 56-29. Required information.

Any recipient of services herein specified shall provide the Fire Department with his or her name, address and telephone number, as well as the name, address and telephone number of his or her insurance carrier, if applicable.

§ 56-30. Fees.

- A. The Fire Department response to rescue shall be reimbursed as follows:
 - (1) Light rescue: \$314.
 - (a) Operations such as stabilizations, use of hand tools, hazard control and other related light rescue.
 - (2) Medium Rescue: \$629.
 - (a) Operations include the use of power tools and hydraulic rescue tools to perform activities such as opening or removing doors to provide access to patients as well as stabilizing vehicles and performing hazardous assessment.
 - (3) Heavy rescue: \$1,259.
 - (a) Operations include any technical rescue procedures, including but not limited to water and ice rescue, rope rescue, confined space rescue, high-angle rescue, trench rescue or structural collapse rescue. Motor vehicle rescue that includes the use of power tools and hydraulic tools to perform operations such as partial or full roof removal, front/dash displacement, third door access and separating vehicles from one another.
 - (4) Technical rescue: There shall be a fee charged for any technical rescue response. Technical rescue includes rope rescue, trench rescue, structural collapse rescue, confined space rescue, and water rescue. Fees for technical rescue services shall be calculated using the following guidelines. [Added 6-25-2019 by Ord. No. 2019-44]
 - (a) Manpower. All manpower fees shall be figured on a per person rate based on that responders assigned position.
 - [1] Chief: Contracted salary rate figured at an overtime rate of 1 1/2 times the hourly rate.

- [2] Officers: Top contracted salary figured at an overtime rate of 1 1/2 times the hourly rate.
- [3] Firefighters: Top contracted salary rate figured at an overtime rate of 1 1/2 times the hourly rate.
- [4] Emergency medical technician: Top contracted salary rate figured at an overtime rate of 1 1/2 times the hourly rate.
- (b) Apparatus.
 - [1] Aerial apparatus: \$300 per hour.
 - [2] Fire engine: \$250 per hour.
 - [3] Ambulance: \$200 per hour.
 - [4] Support/command: \$150 per hour.
- (c) Equipment. A fee shall be charged at replacement cost plus 10% for any damaged equipment or equipment that has to be placed out of service after an incident.
- (d) Contracted services. A fee shall be charged for permit-required confined space rescue/recovery operations and standby services. Any municipality or industrial business that operates or has the potential to operate in permit-required confined spaces shall be assessed an annual service fee as described below.
 - [1] Annual fee.
 - [a] One to 10 permit-required confined spaces: \$1,000.
 - [b] Each additional permit-required confined space: \$200.
 - [c] Total fee not to exceed: \$4,000.
 - [2] Standby fee (noncontracted). The fee for permit-required confined space standby service requests shall be calculated using the service fees outlined in this § 56-30A(4).
 - [3] Standby fee (contracted). The annual fee for contracted facilities for permit-required confined space standby services shall cover the apparatus and equipment fees (unless damaged). Manpower shall be calculated as an additional charge following the fee schedule set forth in this § 56-30A(4).
- B. As per Ordinance No. 2001-41 the above fees will increase 3% annually.

§ 56-31. Enforcement.

The Fire Department and Comptroller's Office shall establish a third-party billing

§ 56-32

program to collect the aforesaid fees. Any applicable charges for rescue services rendered to a person shall be billed to said person and/or said person's insurance carrier.

§ 56-32. Duty to respond.

The Fire Department has the duty to rescues, notwithstanding the ability to pay or lack of insurance of the recipient of said rescue services. The Fire Department shall not refuse nor delay any emergency service to any person, firm, organization or company based on the ability to pay or lack of insurance.
